Dear parents and carers

Welcome to the first edition of The Link this academic year.

It was lovely to welcome children back this week and thank you for supporting us by sending them in correct uniform and ready for learning. I must say that Year 7 have made an excellent start, quickly settling in to school life - well done! Over the summer there have been further improvements to our school site to make it even better for our children and staff. Thank you to Miss Gibbs, Operations Manager, our Site Team, led by Mr Coleman, Site Manager and Mr Morgan, ICT Technician for such hard work to make our school ready for pupils and staff alike.

Whilst it has been relatively short week for our pupils, staff have been working hard since Monday in preparation for the start of term, so that learning can take place immediately. Homework is often a divisive subject in schools, some Parents and Students will feel that there is not enough being set, while others will feel there is too much. What is beyond doubt is that homework is a very important part of your child's education. Not only does it provide them with an opportunity to practise and embed the new learning they complete in school, but it also teaches them to be independent, take initiative and responsibility for completing a task and develop self-discipline. Homework will teach students to find and employ resources such as libraries, the internet and other learning materials. Actively searching for source materials to find information will help you develop important study skills. There is extensive research showing the link between the completion of homework tasks and improved academic achievement and it helps to improve students' memories and critical thinking.

Whilst the benefits of homework are undeniable, we never want students to feel like the protagonist of Ken Nesbitt's poem. So, to help ensure your child is not overwhelmed with too many homework tasks at once we have developed a balanced homework timetable. Staff will be setting homework tasks using this timetable from next week and instructions and links to resources can be found on Go4Schools. The tasks staff set will be focussed on the topics being covered in class, will have a suggested length of time that the task should take and an appropriate deadline. We do not expect students to complete tasks overnight or to spend an excessive amount of time completing them, as this can lead to homework tasks having a negative impact on learning.

Our use of IT at Church Stretton School has developed rapidly over the last few years, and we aim to teach students to develop the IT skills they will need in the next steps of their education and into the world of work. We make use of a variety of IT platforms, and we have been supporting all Year 7 students and the students who have joined us in other Year groups with logging on to the school network and Go4Schools. They have been given a printout of their username and email address and we encouraged to set a secure and memorable password.

We understand that there are varying levels of computer literacy within our school community and how frustrating it can be for students, parents, and carers when there are difficulties accessing our IT platforms. Therefore, we aim to provide user guides and how to videos for the most common issues students experience, which can be found on the school website here. If your child is still experiences problems with our IT platforms, please contact admin@csschool.co.uk and we will endeavour to help them logon as soon as possible.

Go4Schools is a very powerful online system that allows parents and students to access information about:

- academic data,
- timetables,
- homework,
- attendance,
- reports,
- and behaviour.

User guides, providing step-by-step instructions for logging on to the Go4Schools website and the mobile app, were shared with Year 7 parents in this letter and can also be found on the school website here. Parents and students must set up their own separate accounts with Go4Schools and not share one. This is because links to relevant information may differ on students' and parents' pages. Without both account types, important information might be missed.

One of the many benefits of having a Parent Go4Schools account is the ability to monitor the homework tasks that your child has been set. The homework timetable has been developed to make sure that it fits with their planned activities and assessments, without overburdening students. I have included details of the most frequently used online platforms that we use to set homework and revision activities on, and the logon details students should use to access them.





Office 365 – every student at Church Stretton School has an Office365 account, which gives them an Outlook email account that will allow them to communicate with Staff and their peers. It also gives them access to the latest Office apps, like Word, Excel, PowerPoint and Teams, plus 1 TB of cloud storage for their school work. Students can install Office on their home devices free of charge, allowing them to access the Office apps even when they are offline.




