#### **Safer Schools**

As an accredited Shropshire 'Safer School', we recently hosted a visit involving Mr Bartlett who is Crime Prevention Officer for Shropshire Council, the local Policing team (thank you to PCSO Dave Baron who is always so supportive of our work) and Mr Longhurst, Assistant Headteacher. Following the visit, Mr Bartlett has shared his thoughts which we are delighted to share with you:

Following the success of the school's Safer School accreditation in the Summer term this year, Mr Longhurst chaired an annual meeting to update the school's involvement in the security/safety process. As previously, real commitment and comprehensively following the process. This included Safer School surveys of parents/ students and reviewing incidents over the past year. Extremely positive feedback from the surveys and no recorded incidents. The school has good reason to be satisfied and the process continues with a future meeting planned for Autumn 2023. Excellent work!

As with all schools in the county, West Mercia Police support school involvement in the Safer School initiative and they attended the meeting at Church Stretton School. Police attendance is much appreciated by schools.

# Year 11 Mock examinations 28<sup>th</sup> November to 9<sup>th</sup> December 2022

The Year 11 Mock Examinations will begin on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> November with the English Language examination. We held an assembly for Year 11 on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> November to reiterate the key exam information and the behaviour expectations for the examination period. This included the importance of having the correct equipment for every examination, for all examinations they will require:

At least two black pens.



A pencil.



· A calculator.



· A rubber.



A ruler



We will not be able to loan students equipment in the examination hall as this causes significant delays and avoidable disruption. Therefore, if your child does not have the required equipment, they must either purchase it this weekend or visit the library on Monday morning where they can purchase all these items.

In the rare circumstances that students are unable to obtain these items of equipment they should see a member of the pastoral team or SLT so that we can help them source them. Students will also require a compass and protractor for maths exams and colouring pencils for geography and DT examinations. All equipment will need to be carried in a clear pencil case or plastic bag so that the contents can be clearly seen.

We are mindful that examinations can be stressful occasions, we have been in the same situation ourselves and we are keen to do all that we can to help students master their nerves. It is important that we all help students to prepare for success by ensuring they are getting between 8 to 10 hours of sleep a night, eating a healthy meal, including breakfast, and that they take breaks from their revision to exercise and socialise. There is help, support and guidance on the school website Here covering how to revise, how to deal with stress and useful links to documents such as the exam timetable.

Year 11 have had the opportunity to take part in a number of revision workshops during the Autumn term, which have introduced them to the many different methods of revision. We are sure that Year 11 have been trialling these techniques and are beginning to identify which methods work best for them.

We believe that every Year 11 student can achieve amazing results in the Mock Examinations and the GCSE Examinations in the Summer of 2023, and we will continue to do all that we can to support them in doing so.

### Church Stretton School Chrome book leasing programme



The Chromebook leasing scheme was launched last week, which you will have received a letter and flyer about, which explain how the programme works, the specification of the Lenovo 300e Gen3 Chromebook that is available for purchase or lease and details of how to order the device. The Lenovo 300e Gen3 Chromebook's are ordered through, and supplied by, Freedom Tech, which is a technology leasing company that provides students with access to the latest devices in a way that is cost effective. Should you have any questions about the device or how the purchase/leasing scheme works please contact Freedom Tech via email: tech4learners@freedomtech.co.uk or by phone: 02038575632.

By joining this programme students will have a School ready device exclusively for their own use at home, with 3-year extended warranty, accidental damage, and theft insurance, both with £0 excess for a one-off payment of £448.92. Orders can be placed using the portal at <a href="https://www.tech4learners.co.uk">www.tech4learners.co.uk</a>, you can logon by providing your email address, the username: <a href="https://css.co.uk">CSS22</a> and password: <a href="https://ssc.co.uk">S3cure02!</a> The portal is open now and the deadline for orders will be Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> December and the first direct debt payment will be taken on Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> December. We would expect delivery of the devices to be in early January.

Joining the programme is optional, we are simply offering parents/carers the chance to purchase a 'school ready' device that we know would have all the necessary software installed, antivirus protection and security settings to keep students safe. There is no financial gain to Church Stretton School from this scheme and we have worked with several technology suppliers to negotiate the most favourable price. We understand that this cost may not be easily affordable which is why a leasing option is available via monthly direct debit payments over a range of payment terms in addition to the option of outright purchase, for example 36 monthly payments of £14.15. At the end of the leasing period, you will have full ownership of the device. Please can students collect lunch passes for their PE lunch time clubs from the PE office at the start of the week. Students can then show this pass to enter the queue on first calling.




Next week its 'salty snowflakes', we look forward to seeing you there.


