NOTICE TO PARENTS/CARERS SCHOOL ADMISSION ARRANGEMENTS 2024/25

There are no changes proposed to Shropshire Council's admission arrangements for 2024/25 for community and voluntary controlled schools. However, the Council is co-ordinating a consultation for admission authority schools, such as academies, whose trustees are responsible for setting their admission arrangements and who wish to make changes to those arrangements. We wish to notify all parents/carers that the consultation will begin on 5 December 2022 and continue for more than 6 weeks until 20 January 2023.

Proposed changes to Shropshire's admission authority school arrangements are shown below.

 The Trust-Ed CSAT Alliance is proposing to standardise their policies in terms of definitions e.g. children adopted from care. This will apply to:

Alveley Primary School
Castlefields Primary School, Bridgnorth
Stokesay Primary School
St. Leonard's CE Primary School,
Bridgnorth

Belvidere School Church Stretton School Mary Webb School & Science College Meole Brace School Oldbury Wells School

The 3-18 Education Trust is proposing changes to standardise their policies:
 William Brookes School, is proposing the removal of an older sibling in the sixth form and raising the priority of staff criteria.

Thomas Adams School is proposing a lower priority and extension of children of staff criteria. **St. Martin's School** is proposing a higher priority and extension of children of staff criteria and the addition of exceptional medical grounds for secondary applicants.

Coleham Primary School is proposing an extension of children of staff criteria.

The Priory School is proposing an extension to children of staff criteria and higher priority to Shrewsbury catchment children over those outside the catchment with a sibling connection.

- Bridgnorth Endowed School is proposing the addition of children of staff criteria
- Ellesmere Primary School is proposing a reduction to their Published Admission Number from 60 to 45.
- Claverley CE Primary School, Corvedale CE Primary School and Holy Trinity Academy are proposing the removal of faith-related criteria in their policies.
- The Community College, Bishops Castle are consulting on the addition of children of staff criteria.

The following schools are not proposing changes, but they are consulting on their admission arrangements to comply with the School Admissions Code 7-yearly consultation requirement:

Martin Wilson School, Shrewsbury Buildwas Academy Cleobury Mortimer Primary School Idsall School, Shifnal



There will be prizes across four school age categories: Primary (511) and Key Stages 3, 4 and 5 including:

Entries will be judged by a panel, including wildlife author and photographer David Woodfall and winners will be informed, by e-mail, by the 15th January.

Year 10 Geography Field Trip

On the 5th of December 2022, Year 10 geography students went on a field study trip to Birmingham to investigate the impacts of urban regeneration in four areas of the city and to later answer our enquiry question: "To what extent was the regeneration of Brinley place the most successful urban regeneration in Birmingham?".

We arrived mid-morning, got off the coach, and started walking towards our first location, Brinley place. Upon arrival, it was bustling with Christmas shoppers and restaurant goers. We set up a few research studies. First, we counted to see how many pedestrians go up and down the street; then we recorded the decibel level of the area. Afterwards, we observed the surroundings to check for how clean the area was and if its level of public safety was acceptable. Finally, we asked members of the general public questionnaires, such as how far they have come and why they have come here. We did this for three other places: The Mailbox, The Bullring and Eastside. Each with various levels of success; when asking our questionnaires, the older generation were defiantly more willing to stop and talk!

Overall, it was great and successful trip to show Year 10 about urban regeneration in Birmingham. Finn Middleton (Y10)

Church Stretton School Chrome book leasing programme



The Chromebook leasing scheme was launched last week, which you will have received a letter and flyer about, which explain how the programme works, the specification of the Lenovo 300e Gen3 Chromebook that is available for purchase or lease and details of how to order the device. The Lenovo 300e Gen3 Chromebook's are ordered through, and supplied by, Freedom Tech, which is a technology leasing company that provides students with access to the latest devices in a way that is cost effective. By joining this programme students will have a School ready device exclusively for their own use at home, with 3-year extended warranty, accidental damage, and theft insurance, both with £0 excess for a one-off payment of £448.92. Orders can be placed using the portal at www.tech4learners.co.uk, you can logon by providing your email address, the username: CSS22 and password: S3cure02! The portal is open now and the deadline for orders will be Saturday 10th December and the first direct debt payment will be taken on Sunday 25th December. We would expect delivery of the devices to be in early January.


Joining the programme is optional, we are simply offering parents/carers the chance to purchase a 'school ready' device that we know would have all the necessary software installed, antivirus protection and security settings to keep students safe. There is no financial gain to Church Stretton School from this scheme and we have worked with several technology suppliers to negotiate the most favourable price. We understand that this cost may not be easily affordable which is why a leasing option is available via monthly direct debit payments over a range of payment terms in addition to the option of outright purchase, for example 36 monthly payments of £14.15. At the end of the leasing period, you will have full ownership of the device.
