Last weeks sporting results

U16 Hockey team match - We took the U16 boys hockey team to the County Championships to represent Church Stretton against some of the top schools in the county.

Our first game was against Shrewsbury School who we beat 6-0- a tremendous score against such a prestigious sporting school. Our second game was against Ellesmere, a tough game but well-matched ending in 1-1. Our final game to go through to the semi finals was against Wrekin College a very physical team but we came out on top with a 1-0. This meant we were through to the semi finals, currently at 2nd place, to play Adams Grammar who were 1st place in the other pool. They were a well drilled team and unfortunately after a couple of opportunities we just weren't able to score, ending in a loss 4-0 result. Meanwhile on the other pitch Ellesmere had just beaten William Brookes. We ended in a 3rd draw (out of 8 schools) with William Brookes overall, narrowly missing out on the top two sports qualifying for regionals. The boys should be extremely proud of themselves, the target was to play as a team, and that we did. The boys are entered into the 7s County tournament in upcoming weeks where we will try again to qualify for regionals.

- Support your child with reading for purpose. You could read recipes and cook some of these over the Christmas break.


Fresh salad available daily for all Grab & Go items free of charge.
