Last weekend, 68 students from across Year 9 and 10 completed their bronze practice expedition, this invovled students navigating around 12km daily, with some students walking a little further! The students needed to be self-sufficient for over 24 hours and were required to pitch a tent and cook two substantial meals, tea and breakfast. Despite a chilly evening, we couldn't have asked for better weather.



Students rose to the occasion and demonstrated phenomenal navigational skills combined with a record walking pace. Students returned to school on Sunday tired but with a great sense of achievement. We couldn't be more proud of the group, and the students now have a few weeks to recharge their batteries before we go again, with the assessed expedition taking place 11th June - 12th June.

My group and I left school at around 09:45am, we walked to Little Stretton then walked up the hills. We reach the top at around 12:00pm. We may have got a little lost and ended taking a

little longer to get to the campsite but we ended up there in the end, we then set up camp and ate dinner.

The morning after, we packed up our tents and then left the campsite at around 09:00am. We got lost again, earlier than expected, and had to go up a steep hill just to get back on track. Eventually we got to a section of the route that was downhill, it was very refreshing. We eventually arrived back at school at around 12:45pm.




