Dear Parents & Carers,

It has been a complex and demanding half term, but students and staff have worked tremendously hard to support the continuation of school life and adaptations we have had to make along the way.

Of course, we are looking forward to the half term break and hope that it is an enjoyable and safe one for you all. We have been very pleased to see the number of Covid-19 cases falling in our school community, but know how quickly things can change. Therefore, when we return, we will continue to closely monitor the cases of Covid-19 in our community and to minimise risk, we will be keeping some of the measures in place that we reintroduced, including wearing of face coverings in communal areas and on transport to and from school. However, we do want to return some normality for students and staff so:

- Tutor time will return each day with students still required to wear face coverings;
- Assemblies will return as per the rota, students will still be required to wear a face covering:
- Lunchtime and after school clubs are free to continue:
- The lunchtime rota will continue with year group time slots (if students wish to attend a lunchtime club, they must be issued with a lunch pass and come to the first sitting).

Thank you, therefore, for your ongoing support and ensuring your child/ren comes to school with a face covering.

Yesterday, although it was unfortunate not to be able to invite parents/carers of Year 10 in to school for the Progress Evening, we were pleased to be able to offer remote progress evening conversations. Hopefully these discussions were useful for parent/carers to talk about the progress that students are making at the start of their GCSE / Level 2 courses. If things didn't work as planned with the technology, please do contact your child's subject teacher by email so that we can ensure you get the information you need about how your child is getting on.

Finally, students have been issued with more Lateral Flow test kits for use at home. Please do continue testing over the half term break and let us know of any positive cases which prevent students returning to school.

Safer Schools



Church Stretton school continues to work towards a Safer School accreditation. This is a school security initiative created by West Mercia Police and supported by Shropshire

Council. It involves the following aspects:

- 1. Implement basic security measures applicable at all schools i.e. property marking, and visitor passes etc.
- Consider pro-active security/safety measures for the site/ building and/or protecting assets.
- 3. Establish a procedure for recording incidents i.e. anti-social behaviour, vandalism etc. Any recorded information can then be analysed. In addition, the same recording procedure can be used for surveying a problem i.e. an unauthorised thoroughfare.
- 4. If there are any projects to be undertaken, they are prioritised. Following the implementation of a project, the success of it is reviewed.
- 5. PSHE or education of pupils as per the *Safer School* pack. To achieve the accreditation, we have annual *Safer School* meetings, with the next meeting arranged for later this term. Part of the *Safer School* process is gathering the views of parents/carers. Church Stretton School Chrome book leasing programme

Acer Spin 511 Chromebook







The Chromebook leasing scheme was launched this week, which you will have received a letter and flyer about, which explain how the programme works, the specification of the Acer Spin 511 Chromebook that is available for purchase or lease and details of how to order the device. The Acer Spin 511 Chromebook's are ordered through, and supplied by, Freedom Tech, which is a technology leasing company that provides students with access to the latest devices in a way that is cost effective. By joining this programme students will have a School ready device exclusively for their own use at home, with 3-year extended warranty, accidental damage, and theft insurance, both with £0 excess for a one-off payment of £471.48. Orders can be placed using the portal at www.tech4learners.co.uk, you can logon by providing your email address, the username: CSS21 and password: S3cure02! The portal is open now and the deadline for orders for this round will be Wednesday 10th November and the first direct debt payment will be taken on Thursday 25th November. We would expect delivery of the devices to be in December.

Joining the programme is optional, but with the possibility that School may be required to revert to periods of remote learning we are offering parents/carers the chance to purchase a 'school ready' device that we know would have all the necessary software installed, antivirus protection and security settings to keep students safe. There is the added benefit that the School IT manager can remotely assist with any difficulties and provide updates as and when they are required. Leasing the device is an effective way to spread the cost, but will incur an increased cost, which we have broken down in the table below to show you the terms available and the additional cost incurred. The school is not making any money from the programme, our main priority is ensuring as many students as possible have suitable IT equipment that is fit for purpose and provides value for money.
