It was lovely to welcome pupils back to school after what we hope was a good half term break.

For year 11 pupils, their mock examinations are now only a matter of 3 weeks away. I know that many pupils have been benefitting from the 'how to revise' sessions offered by various teachers. However, the actual revision and taking time to engage in proper and purposeful revision is, of course, down to the pupils themselves to do at home. Practicing examination questions using past papers either on hard copy printed versions or using the new feature on Seneca Learning platform which tests pupils ability to answer exam style questions is an excellent way to see what is known and where revision needs to be targeted. Just reading through notes, highlighting words and making post it reminders are much less impactful. Thank you for supporting your child at home with their revision.

With clocks now changed and the night drawing in, we really do feel that autumn term is upon us. The colder and wetter weather has not deterred our fantastic pupils and PE / Sports Partnership staff from engaging in more fixtures and sporting activities. 
