With only 4 weeks of the autumn term remaining, time is certainly marching on.

Well done to year 11 students continue who continue work hard in preparation for their Mock Exams. As Dr Wood stated in his letter last week, we may be asked to provide a Teacher Assessed Grade for students who are unable to sit the GCSE exams in the summer of 2022, as happened last year. The outcome of these Mock Examinations (raw scores) may be used to inform that judgement, so it is really important to do as well as possible.

With the forecast suggesting snow in some areas, you never know what might happen within the microclimate in Church Stretton. Fingers crossed we escape any disruption.


Mussel Experience

This week 8kg of fresh mussels were delivered to school from the 'Fish in Schools Hero' project. A project which aims to ensure that every child gets a chance to prepare, cook and eat fish before they leave school. This offered a fantastic opportunity for the Y10 Food Preparation and Nutrition GCSE students to experience using mussels in their cooking.

The mussels were farmed and provided by Offshore Shellfish Ltd. They were picked on Sunday morning then at 4am on Tuesday were transferred to be chauffer driven up and down the country to schools.

The Y10 students did a fantastic job cleaning, cooking, and presenting the mussels using 3 different recipes: Thai style mussels, Creamy mussels with smoky bacon and Tagliatelle with mussels and creme fraiche. Even the most reluctant students were spotted dipping their bread into the sauce and having taste, some even pleasantly surprised that they enjoyed them. Some staff were also spotted devouring a bowl of sweetcorn and mussel chowder.


