Humanities: KS3 Summer Term



What are we learning, why are we learning it and how you can support.

Dear Students and Parents,

We are thrilled to welcome your children back to school for another exciting year of learning and growth in Humanities at Church Stretton School! Here's a breakdown of what each year group will be getting up to this half-term alongside some useful links that will help you support their study.

KS3 History

Why are we studying this?

Year 7: Year 7 have finished their foundation exams and have started a unit on Tudor Kings, with the aim of deciding how much policy was dictated by personal need. This unit discusses the impact of religious changes before developing into a study of how powerful were Tudor queens.

Year 8: Year 8 are completing a unit on civil rights in the 20th century, with a focus on the suffragettes, Black civil rights and South Africa. They will finish the term with a study of the Russian Revolution, its causes and consequences.

Year 9: Year 9 have just completed a unit on genocide in the 20th century. They will be building on their work in Year 8 with a final investigation into the Cold War.

KS3 History at Church Stretton School

KS3 RPE

Why are we studying this?

Year 7 – Year 7 are currently finishing offtheir study of Christianity and the Life of Jesus Christ. They will finish the term having moved onto Islam and the Life of Prophet Muhammad.

Year 8 – Year 8 have just finished their topic on Islam and the Life of Prophet Muhammad. After this Year 8 will begin their next topic on authorities and holy texts.

Year 9 – Year 9 are completing their work on Philosophy and its ideas. They are looking at the different ways philosophy has impacted the modern world and pers pectives. They will be working on this until the end of the year.

- Talk to your child about what they have been studying in less ons
- Encourage them to read through class notes on a regular basis

KS3 Geography

Why are we studying this?

Year 7: Year 7 have just finished their foundation exam and are moving on to a new topic looking at rivers. They will be studying the features of rivers, how these can change over time and the processes that cause these changes.

Year 8: Students will be continuing with their topic of coasts and are now focusing on how the changing environment effects people. After this we will be moving on to look at the geography of China as a rapidly growing economy

Year 9: Students are continuing with their topic on Plate tectonics focusing on volcanoes. After this we will be moving on to look at the geography of Rio de Janeiro as a rapidly growing city.
