Meanwhile, year 8 pupils enjoyed some geography fieldwork experience through a trip to the Lapworth museum of geology at Birmingham University. #### **Behaviour Policy**

As we approach the end of the school year we take time to reflect on what has worked well and also look where we can make changes to make things even better. We review our policies and where necessary make changes that will come in to effect from September.

One of the policies that we will review is our behaviour policy as this is an integral part of any school. Before the end of term, we will be working with staff, students and our Governors to look at current provision for rewards and sanctions. Activities will be set during tutor time for students to have their say on what works well and what could be done differently. The tutor group representatives will then bring the feedback to the school council meeting on the 21st June. Alongside this will be a staff and governor working party who will be completing a similar exercise. We will use this valuable feedback to review our behaviour policy. ## Creative Arts: KS3 Summer Term



What are we learning, why are we learning it and how you can support.

The summer term is underway and we are making final arrangements for the end of a busy academic year. We have an upcoming performance and gallery eventtaking place and activities to plan for enrichment week.

Below are the details of what students have been doing in lessons

#### Year 7

Drama – last half-term students have been developing theirs torytelling theatre techniques using the story of a dragon. This term, s tudents are being introduced to using masks in performance and devising

Music – last half-term students have been developing their guitar playing skills. This half-term students are developing their ensemble music skills to perform pieces as part of a group.

Art – this term students have been developing oil pastel blending techniques and working towards a final piece taking inspiration from the impressionist movement.

#### Year 9

Drama – last half-term students have been presenting extracts from the play, Blood Brothers by Willy Russell and learning about how to action dialogue appropriately. This half-term, students are developing their devising skills by creating original drama pieces taking inspiration from different stimulus.

Music—last half-term students have been working on small group performances of popular songs. This half term, students are looking specifically at creating a cover version and investigating how to make pieces of music different from the original.

Art - last half-term students have been finishing their glazed stoneware tiles. This half-term students are focussing on developing their skills in two-point perspective drawing.

#### How can you support?

- Talk about the learning and activities your child has been taking part in. Ask them about musicians, artists and theatre practitioners they are learning and encourage them to independently explore artists and practitioners.
- Encourage them to attend lunchtime activities in the arts. There is something to do every lunchtime in drama, music and art.
- Don't forget to look at our curriculum page which includes the Programme of Study and all our useful links and resources.

#### Year 8

Drama – last half-term students have been creating work inspired by Victorian Melodrama. This half-term students are working on extracts of Shakespeare plays using ensemble approaches inspired by the Royal Shakespeare Company.

Music – last half -term students have been looking at the work of classical composers such as Mozart, through performing and composing. This half term, students will be looking at 20<sup>th</sup> Century 'Weird and Wonderful' Music.

Art – this term students have been developing their observational drawing skills and working towards their Cubist collage focussing on the artists, Pablo Picasso and Georges Braque.

Year 11 - students are carrying out their final non-exam assessments and written examinations this term. We would like to thank them all for their hard work and wish them well with their future ventures.

Year 10 – students are beginning their non-exam assessments which will form part of their final GCSE grades as well as working hard to support enrichment activities in school.

#### Year 10

Drama – last half-term students have been presenting their final performances for visiting examination as part of their GCSE drama. This half-term, students have sattheir final written exam and completed their non exam assessments.

Music – last half-term students have been creating music for film. This half-term students are working on their solo and ensemble performances.

Art - lasthalf-term students have been creating pieces based on the theme of personal identity. This half-term students are continuing to develop their portfolio by creating portraits and developing their oilskills, glazing and working towards printmaking.

#### Year 11

Drama – lasthalf-term students have been presenting their final performances for visiting examination as part of their GCSE drama. This half-term, students have sat their final written exam and completed their non exam assessments.

Music – lasthalf-term students have been preparing for the Listening and Appraising exam.

Art – this term year 11 have completed their final examination pieces alongside their final portfolio. We look forward to displaying their work as part of the summer showcase.
