- . Students will be allowed to wear their own clothes during Enrichment Week, these must be appropriate for the activities.
- . School PE kit is to be worn for the PE day.
- Students will only require a packed lunch for the day trips they are going on. Children in receipt of free school meals will be provided with a packed lunch.
- Please can you ensure that you have completed the consent form on ParentPay for the walk on Friday if your child would like to take part.

### KIT LIST for Adventure Wales from Mr Wright

This is a water sports holiday and so we are going to get wet, so I recommend that one or two black bin liner type bags are packed so that wet clothes are separated from dry ones.

- Sun cream, Sun hat and sunglasses because I am an optimist.
- A water bottle.
- Showering equipment and toothbrush and toothpaste, because I'm an optimist, wrapped in a waterproof bag, so we have no leakages in transit. A towel for washing should also be brought.
- Whilst technical equipment related to the activities will be provided, such as wetsuits and life jackets, the nature of the activities will mean clothing during the day will get wet.
- Swimming shorts or costumes are advisable but clothes to wear over them which are likely to get wet on day 2 and 3 will also be needed.
- For the gorge walking and the beach students will need a pair of trainers that will get wet.
- Students will need a towel to use at the gorge scrambling and the beach.
- The beach especially can be windy, so a fleece or similar warmer clothing is advisable.
- A waterproof coat.
- The clothes that students travel in on the Monday should be ones they do not mind getting wet and muddy as there will be no opportunity to change before they start the first day's activities that include a muddy assault course.
- Pyjamas or sleepy suit.
- A day bag so they can have dry clothes, can store a water bottle, carry their packed lunch. Again, I would suggest that anything in it is in a plastic bag so that if it rains what is inside does not get wet.
- Clothes that you can change into in the evenings once you are dry and clean.
- Ensure you have dry and comfy clothes still available for your journey back.
- For all events please be aware of the weather forecast to pack appropriate clothing.
- Games such as playing cards, a football, tennis ball, a reading book, crosswords or sudokus could be brought to use in free time or to calm them down at bedtime.
- A torch.
- Snacks can be brought but try and avoid things with a high sugar content as this can contribute to them being unsettled when we are getting them to sleep.
- Mobile phones will be allowed as they may wish to contact you about when we will arrive back and use it on the coach journey. However, they will be the child's responsibility while they are there. If your child misuses their mobile in any way it will be taken off them and returned to you when you pick them up. Students should not take pictures of other students as these may then be passed around and used against that person's wishes. If they choose to bring it, we will be taking it off them before bedtime on the Monday evening and they will have some limited time in the evenings when they can use them should they want to. I shall suggest that students return to their dorms at 9:30 pm to get ready for bed with lights out at 10:00 pm so you might wish to discuss this and the mobile phone restrictions before we travel. I hope that your child is excited about this visit I am, I'm sure it will be a great experience. If you have any further questions, please get in touch.














#### **Creative Arts**
