

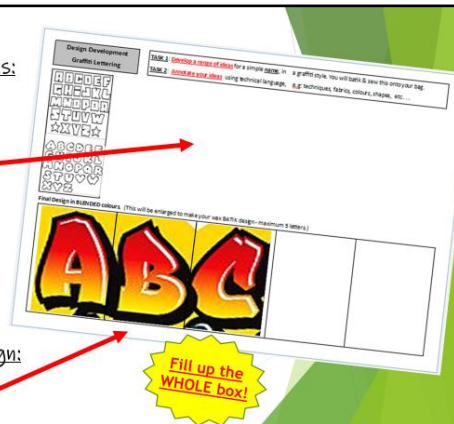

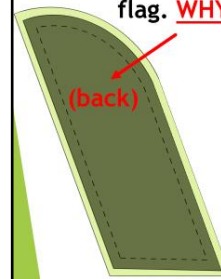


We are using . . . wax Batik & blended dyes

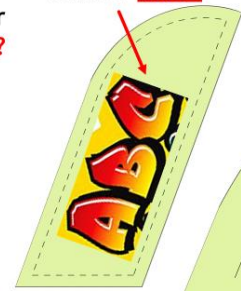


Manufacturing

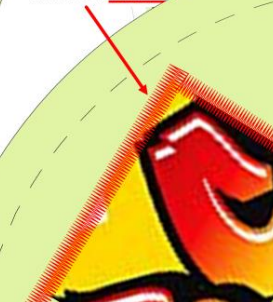
1: Cut out **INTER-FACING** and iron to the **back** of your flag. **WHY?**



2: **PIN** your batik name in the centre. **WHY?**



3: **APPLIQUE** (zigzag) stitch around your name. **WHY?**



Templates & Fabric

seam allowance 1.5cm

Flag template (your name)

You choose the length based on your letters.

Point the pins **TOWARDS** the fabric edge

Carefully cut around the template, **AVOIDING PINS!**

Finished? Work on your folder

sewing line cutting line

OVERLOCKING

1. Cut out a **BACK** fabric piece using your paper template.

2. **PIN** the front and back pieces together **INSIDE OUT**.

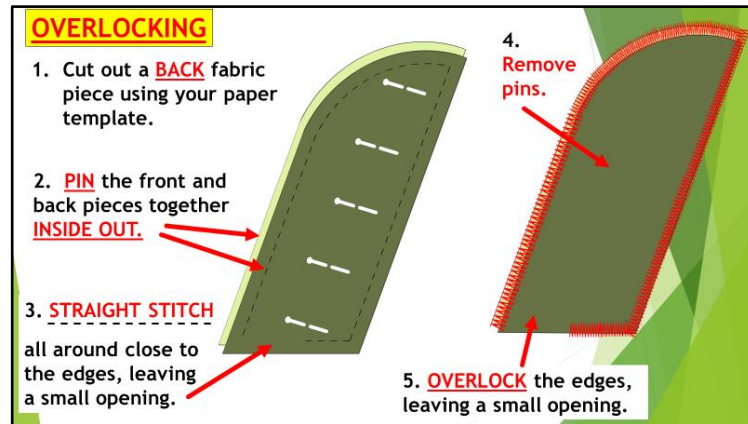
3. **STRAIGHT STITCH**

all around close to the edges, leaving a small opening.

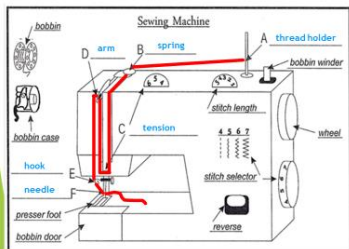
4.

Remove pins.

5. **OVERLOCK** the edges, leaving a small opening.



Sewing Machine - just sews



Practice threading up!

Overlocker - cuts & sews



DO NOT LIFT PRESSER FOOT!! just **SIT AND SEW!**

Remove Wax

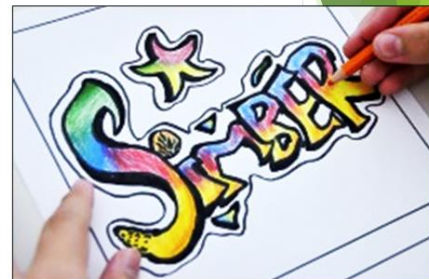
1: Iron your batik inside some newspaper.



Mind your fingers!!

Add detail

2: Use sharpie pens to neaten the outlines around your batik work. Make a feature of the drips!



CASING (fabric tube)

1. Turn the fabrics **RIGHT SIDE OUT**.

Iron flat, tucking in the rough edges of the opening.

2. Use **STRAIGHT STITCH** to sew up the opening.

3. **CASING:** Straight stitch 2cm from the edge of the fabric to create a **TUBE** for the pole.

4. **SNIP** a tiny hole to insert the pole.
